Year Six

Spring Term

English

This term the children's writing will focus on fiction and non-fiction texts such as recounts, biographies and information texts.

Fiction writing will focus on the genre of historical as well sci-fi. Our historical writing will be based on a whole class text, which will provide a stimulus for the children to write in role and develop characterisation.

We will look at how best to structure various types of writing so they suit their purpose. In addition, to prepare the children for the Grammar SATs, we will place an even greater emphasis on punctuation and the rules of English grammar.


We will also be familiarising the children with the structure and expectations of the Reading SAT paper.



Maths

Our focus in Maths this term will be to develop the children's abilities in applying their mathematical knowledge. To best prepare them for next term's SATs, we will be introducing them to the style and content they can expect to see.

We will continue to review and consolidate understanding of the core mathematical subject knowledge as well as introducing and expanding their understanding of concepts such as translation, ratio, proportion, probability, algebra, representing data and geometry.



Science

The science this term will start with a look at living things and their habitats. Later we will explore evolution and inheritance.

We will also continue the process of reviewing the children's knowledge of the entire science curriculum to ensure a thorough grounding in preparation for secondary school.

Humanities

This term's topic is 'The Tudors in our Local Area'.

This unit allows the children to undertake personal research projects and draw on their learning and enquiry skills from across the curriculum.

They will investigate key questions such as: "Who were the Tudors?", "What important Richmond landmarks are from the Tudor period?" and "What was Tudor life like?".

To compliment their studies, we will be visiting Hampton Court Palace and the site of Richmond Palace.



Lesson Equipment

All children should come to school with a pencil case and the necessary equipment for the day.

This should include: a blue handwriting pen (no biros. Blue Friction Rub-out pens are particularly useful!), whiteboard pen, a pencil, sharpener, eraser and glue stick.

Computing

The children will continue to work on the design and development of their apps. In doing so they will have the opportunity to develop additional programming skills.



Religious Education



The children will study the theme of "The Journey of life and death". We appreciate that this may be a sensitive subject for some children, so please do contact us if you have

or foresee any concerns.

In addition, the children will look at the contemporary Anglican church and the message of hope that Easter brings to Christians.

PE

Lessons will cover general fitness training and the skills and tactics required for ball sports. Indoor activities will include the annual SMSP Dance Challenge.



Art

The art focus will be 'People in Motion', looking at how artists depict movement in art.



Music

The children will be learning about the musical traditions of the Tudor period. This will include looking at Tudor instruments and using musical frameworks to compose in the Renaissance style.

This term, we will be exploring the School Values in greater detail. We will use the topic of our Curriculum

Week 'Make it a bet lessons. Additionally, continue to have Circle to discuss on concerns the child have.
