English


The initial focus prior to SATs will be revision of grammar knowledge and to continue practising reading comprehension skills.

After SATs, we will continue to produce writing samples for our writing portfolio to ensure that the children are able to write for a wide range of purposes.

We will also undertake work based on our School Journey and to contribute to the yearbook.

Mathematics

Work this term will commence with a concentration on revision for SATs. We will be revising major areas such as: fractions; decimals and percentages; ratio and proportion; shape, space and measures; area and perimeter; data handling; algebra; and problem solving.




Later there will be a focus on investigative mathematics, providing opportunities for the children to apply their mathematical knowledge to 'real-life' problems.

Towards the end of the year, we will also look at developing the children's understanding and confidence in managing their own finances.

Science

During this term, the children will be taught about electricity which will involve building simple and parallel circuits, and then drawing diagrams to show their work. There will also be some general revision of all of the primary science curriculum.



Humanities

This term's topic is the Isle of Wight. We will prepare the children for their visit by researching places of interest on the island as well as looking at some of the features of coastlines.



The children will also be using maps with co-ordinates, keys and appropriate symbols for the identification of features and places.

Religious Education

This term, we will continue to explore the Christian faith through different denominations and we have arranged a visit from the youth outreach from St Stephens Church in Twickenham. We will then compare elements of the Christian faith to other religions within our local communities.

PE


Lessons will involve athletic activities where children will be encouraged to develop their running style and improve reaction times. They will practise relay skills and participate in races over longer distances. Lessons will also involve standing long jumps, triple jumps and javelin.



DT

The children will be using their skills of analysing, designing, producing and evaluating to create a pair of slippers.

Please be advised that, nearer the time, children will need to bring in materials from home to create their individual designs.



Computing

The children will continue the unit of work based on safety: they will learn the importance of responsible internet use and how to keep personal information safe. This will contribute to their social and emotional wellbeing and enable them to develop resilience.



They will also learn about coding and complete their new app design.

PSHE

Lessons this term will focus on children's wellbeing with a strong focus on how to deal with anxiety and potential stress relating to SATS and transition. We will also continue with Sex and Relationship Education.

Our trip to the Isle of Wight will enable us to focus on developing independence and self-esteem in preparation for the transition to secondary school.

Homework

Homework this term will involve revision tasks in preparation for the SATs.

Homework will be given out on a **Thursday** and is due back by the following **Tuesday**.

Please encourage your child to complete homework tasks and hand their work in on time. This will be good preparation for life at Secondary School.

LESSON EQUIPMENT

All children should come to school with a pencil case and the necessary equipment for the day.

This should include: a blue handwriting pen (no biro), a pencil, sharpener, ruler, eraser and glue stick.

PE KITS

P.E. kits will be needed in school every day.

Children require separate outdoor and indoor shoes.

Your child may not be allowed to participate in P.E. lessons without a full kit.

As the weather becomes hotter, please ensure your child has sun-cream and a hat for their protection

In addition, please discuss the importance of deodorant.

SATs

Please make note that the SATs will take place on the week commencing Monday 13th May 2019. The schedule (as decided by the DfE) is as follows:

Monday	Grammar/Spelling test
Tuesday	Reading test
Wednesday	Maths paper 1 and 2: Arithmetic and Reasoning
Thursday	Maths paper 3: Reasoning

Please ensure your child arrives at school promptly in the mornings and avoid arranging dentist appointments, etc. during school time for this week.

The children will need to bring any relevant equipment for the tests, ie. pen, pencil, ruler and rubber into school in a clear plastic bag or pencil case.
