



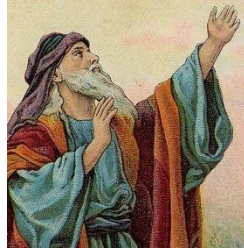

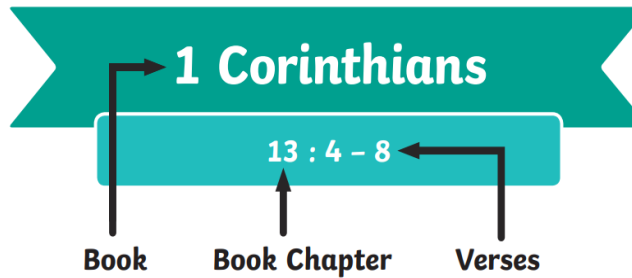

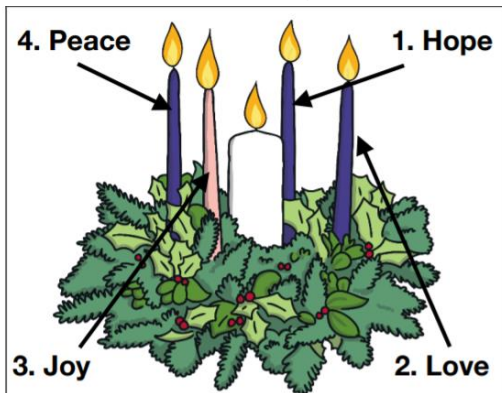
## How to find a Bible verse

Finding your way around the Bible can be confusing. Each reading in the Bible is shown in a certain way. Use the contents page to find the 'book', then find the 'chapter' (bigger number) and finally the 'verses' (smaller numbers).



## The Advent Wreath

A candle is lit on each of the four Sundays leading up to, and on Christmas Day. Each candle represents something different.



## Feast of Epiphany

A special date in the Christmas story when people celebrate how a star led the Magi - also known as The Three Wise Men - to visit the baby Jesus after he had been born. It is when baby Jesus was 'revealed' to the world.



## Key Vocabulary

<b>The Bible</b>	Holy book for Christians.
<b>Old Testament</b>	The first 39 books of the Bible. Written <b>before Jesus</b> was born.
<b>New Testament</b>	27 books originally written in Greek telling the life of Jesus and the early church. Written <b>after Jesus</b> was born.
<b>Prophecy</b>	A prediction of future events – the message is inspired by God.
<b>Prophet</b>	Someone appointed by God to be His messenger.
<b>Advent</b>	The time leading up to Christmas when people prepare for Jesus' coming.
<b>Epiphany</b>	A day marking the visit of the wise men to Jesus. Comes from the Greek word meaning 'to reveal'.
<b>Incarnation</b>	Incarnation means that Jesus is God in the flesh, and that, in Jesus, God came to live among humans.
