



What do the Miracles tell us about Jesus?

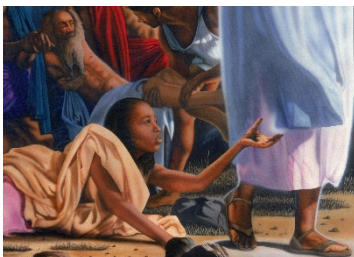


Wedding at Cana

Jesus fed 5000 people with five loaves of bread and two fishes. He prayed over the food and it multiplied so much that it was enough to feed all the 5000 people.

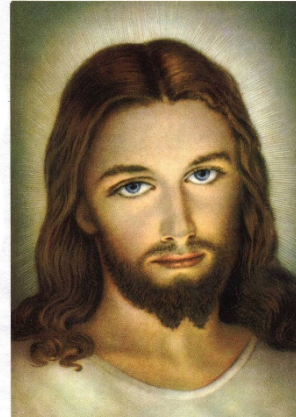
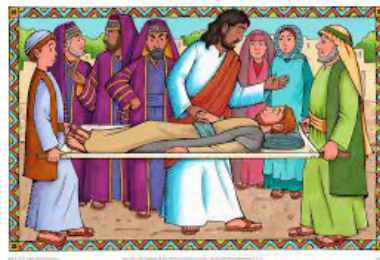


The woman who touched Jesus' garment

Key Vocabulary

Miracle	When Christians talk about a miracle, they mean an event that is not 'normal'. Many of Jesus' miracles involve taking the ordinary things of life and transforming them into the extraordinary.
Healing	The curing of sickness.
Gospels	The record of the life and teachings of Jesus found in the first four books of the New Testament.
Faith	Belief and trust in God. Assurance of things hoped for.
Resurrection	The rising of the dead. The new/risen life of a Christian.
Incarnation	Incarnation means that Jesus is God in the flesh, and that, in Jesus, God came to live among humans.

Christians believe these miracles remind us about the 'storms' in life and how we can trust God to be the guide through our 'storms' and to bring calmness to our life.
