The **Star of David** is the symbol of the Jewish community.



A **kippah** is a special cap worn by Jewish men and boys to show respect



A **tallit** is a special prayer shawl used by Jewish men to pray.



The **Torah** is the first part of the Jewish bible. It is a scroll written in Hebrew. Jewish people believe that the Torah shows how God wants Jews to live.



A **yad** is a hand-held pointing stick used to read the Torah as no one is allowed to touch the scroll.
