


Recorders

How to play the notes B, A, G on the recorder:



A recorder is a member of the woodwind family along with the:

flute
piccolo
clarinet
cor anglais
bassoon
saxophone

How to remember the notes of the treble clef

For notes on the lines use 'Every Good Boy Deserves Football' (EGBDF)



For notes in the spaces use FACE



When we blow the recorder we use 'feather breath'.

Feather breath is a steady, gentle breath that creates an even, smooth sound.





How to draw a treble clef


A treble clef is a symbol used at the start of a piece of music for a high-pitched instrument such as a recorder, a violin or the right hand of the piano.


Trace these shapes to make a treble clef:















Parts of a recorder



What is a stave?

A stave is made from 5 lines and is a bit like a musical ladder.

We can put musical notes on a stave to make music that is high, low or somewhere inbetween.
