Some farms have animals like cows, chickens, sheep, pigs and goats. These animals need to be fed every day and looked after to make sure they grow up to be healthy.


Some farms collect the eggs produced by the chickens. Most chickens lay eggs every day. These eggs are taken and put into boxes to be sold.


When cows are milked, the milk is taken to be cleaned before being put into bottles.
