MATHS

Children will:


- •continue to develop their subitising skills (seeing the quantity without counting) for numbers within and beyond 5, and increasingly connect quantities to numerals
- begin to identify missing parts for numbers within 5
- •explore the structure of the numbers 6 and 7
- •focus on equal and unequal groups when comparing numbers
- ·understand that two equal groups can be called a 'double' and connect this to finger patterns
- ·sort odd and even numbers
- continue to develop their understanding of the counting sequence
- ·order numbers and play track games
- •join in with verbal counts beyond 20

PHONICS & LITERACY

Children will be consolidating their knowledge of all single sounds and will be learning all digraphs and trigraphs.

They will be continuing to practise their blending and segmenting skills in their reading and writing.

In their writing, the children will be focussing on their letter formation. They will be starting to write simple sentences, using finger spaces, full stops and capital letters.




